**Tap your toes to local brass bands at the Pantiles**

There's more than just smooth jazz at the Pantiles this summer; there's a great line up of brass bands too. Head on down to the Pantiles for a Sunday afternoon full of great food and traditional brass music played on the bandstand by some of the best local bands in the area.

- East Grinstead Town Band, Sunday 29 June, 12:30–1:30pm and 2-3pm
- Kent Police Band, Sunday 6 July, 2-4pm
- Cranbrook Town Band, Sunday 13 July, 2-4pm

Expect lively music when the East Grinstead Concert Band takes to the stage, fresh from playing at the popular Eastbourne bandstand.

The Kent Police Band was formed in 1977 when three serving officers expressed an interest in getting brass musicians together to form a dedicated band. Originally only police officers could play in the band, but today both serving and retired officers play alongside civilian members under the musical direction of John Groves. Over the years the band has performed well loved brass tunes in various parts of the UK and around the world. More recently, the band performed at a police bravery awards ceremony held at 10 Downing Street.

The Cranbrook Town Band loves playing good brass music, and is proud of its home town in the Wealden countryside. The 30 or so brass musicians who play with the band all live in and around the historic market town of Cranbrook. The band's history goes right back to the 1920s but the present band was re-formed forty years ago. Come along and enjoy some great local music lead by Musical Director Ian Lanceley.
